| Activity Title | Art in Nature (Drawing with Trees) | |
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| Activity Overview | In this activity, you will use the movement of trees to make exciting new drawings. | |
| Activity Steps | Notes | Resources |
| Find a tree with a strong branch that you can reach from the floor. | It pays to be patient: Take your time to find the right tree that moves a lot in the wind. | |
| Carefully attach a pen to the end of a branch using a small amount of tape. | You don't need to use much tape for the pen to hold. | Drawing Pen and masking tape. |
| Take the lid off the pen. | | |
| Hold your paper underneath the pen and wait for the wind! | If you can rest your paper on the ground this works even better! | Pad of paper. |
| Watch how the pen traces the movement of the tree in the wind making interesting marks. | | |
| When you are happy with your drawing re-attach the lid to your pen and carefully remove the pen from the tree. | Be careful not to break the branch of the tree and make sure you collect any rubbish before you go home. | |
| Make as many of these drawings as you like. Why don't you explore how different trees make different drawings? | Experiment with different coloured pens and paper too! | |
