

Activity Title	The Art of Improvisation		
Activity Overview	In this activity, you will make a visual re-interpretation of your favourite song or piece of music.		
Activity Duration	1 Hour	Resources Required	➤ Coloured pencils and pens, paper and your imagination
Activity Summary			
<p>Have you ever wondered what music looks like?</p> <p>Art and music have a long history of inspiring each with artists inspiring composers and musicians, and musicians and composers influencing artists.</p> <p>Have you ever considered what your favourite song or piece of music might look like? After today's activity you will have a piece of art to complement your favourite song.</p> <p>To achieve the best results, try not to 'illustrate' the music by drawing what the lyrics are about for example. Instead, try and use a visual language of line, marks, shapes and colours and let your imagination go wild, depicting instead how the music makes you feel.</p> <p>For this we can use...</p> <p>Different types of line: Thin lines, thick lines and wavy lines.</p> <p>Different Shapes: Triangles, squares and circles.</p> <p>Different Marks: Dashes, dots and tone.</p> <p>Different Colours: Red, yellow and blue.</p> <p>Think about how the music makes you feel and how a colour could represent that. For example, does yellow make you feel happy or sad?</p> <p>Listen to your song or piece of music through a couple of times before you begin to draw and think about how it makes you feel and the visual language you could use to depict it.</p> <p>When you are confident, let your imagination go wild and draw your music or song!</p> <p>Don't forget to upload and share your work</p>
