

MEDICATION GUIDANCE Summer School

We request that NO medication be brought into the College. Any medications that have been brought in will be held by Concord Staff. This will include ANY over the counter medicines such as pain relief tablets or Herbal supplements and must be handed into College staff within 24 hours of arrival. Failure to do so will result in action being taken possibly resulting in students being asked to leave the programme.

In the event that a medication has been **PRESCRIBED** to a student and we have been informed in advance, the medication MUST be accompanied by a Doctors' prescription that has been translated into English. We are unable to administer **any** mediation not in English

Our medical team will need to know from the prescription:

- The name of the medication
- What it is for and what the dosage is
- How often the medication needs to be taken and what route
- Any special storage instructions

The medication needs to be within its expiry date and if possible in its original packaging. It MUST have the student name, date of birth, on both the prescription and the medication.

Please be aware that our Nurses are governed by the <u>Nursing and Midwifery Council</u> (NMC) and are only able to administer medication that has been prescribed by a Doctor registered on the General Medical Council (GMC).

There may be occasions were certain medications may not be able to be administered by our Nurses but may be administered by an Agent or self administered. This does NOT include emergency life-saving medication for example Auto Adrenaline Injector Pens or asthma inhalers.

The following medicines are held by the medical team and made available to students when required:
